Michael Koch was born in Lucerne (Switzerland) in 1982. From 2003 - 2008 he studied at the Academy of Media Arts in Cologne.


His short films have been shown at over 100 international film festivals and won several awards. His graduation film "Polar" received a Special Mention at the 2009 Berlin International Film Festival and won both the German Camera Award and the German Short Film Award.

Koch's debut feature film "Marija" had its world premiere in Competition at the Locarno International Film Festival in 2016. The film was internationally screened at several festivals such as in Toronto, Busan, Angers and Gothenburg, winning numerous national and international awards.

His second feature film "Drii Winter" (A Piece Of Sky) was invited to the international Competition at the 72nd Berlin International Film Festival and received a Special Mention from the jury. The film screened at over 50 festivals and won prizes in Chicago, Thessaloniki and Gent.

In 2023 the film was awarded with the Swiss Film Award for Best Feature Film. "Drii Winter" (A Piece Of Sky) was Switzerland's official submission for the International Feature Film competition at the 95th Academy Awards®

Koch lives and works together with his wife and three children in Basel and Berlin.

Luis travels to the mountains to reconnect with his father, who lives in a remote village. There he finds out his father has a new family. Torn between anger, incomprehension and the desire for emotional closeness, Luis tries to draw his father out.
